

Child protection – risks in displacement

- → Refugee children are more vulnerable to violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect
- → Globally, only 1 in 2 refugee children are registered at birth
- → Globally, 50% of child refugees do not finish primary school





Best Interests Principle

Article 3.1 CRC

Actions affecting all children or groups of children

measures of a general nature that inform and affect the best interests process for individual children

National Legislation

The best interests principle is also adopted in various national child protection laws.

- According to the Committee on the Rights of the Child, the principle should be:
- Reflected in domestic laws, in child-rights statutes and in "sectoral" laws (health, education, etc.)
- Written in a way that enables it to be invoked before the courts.



Importance of National Systems

→ State Responsibility:

UNHCR and partners work to supplement and strengthen the national child protection systems only where gaps exist or where States are unwilling to extend services to refugees.

→ Where States have established procedures with capacity to adjudicate child protection issues, UNHCR defers.
