Test the conspiracy theories are for losers hypothesis


■ When on losing side of politics → perfect storm of uncertainty/anxiety and powerlessness






Predicted Value on Republican Index Among Dems and Reps – Sp/Su 2016







Predicted Value on **Democratic Index** Among Dems and Reps – Sp/Su 2016







Predicted Value on Conspiratorial Thinking Difference Scale Among Clinton and Trump Voters – Pre/Post 2016 Election







Predicted Value on Conspiratorial Voters, Fall 2017 & March 2018













Predicted Value on Republican Indices Among Clinton and Trump Voters, Fall 2017 & March 2018






Predicted Value on and Democratic Indices Among Clinton and Trump Voters, Fall 2017 & March 2018
